Information Request - 111 calls for children trapped in vehicles

I refer to your official information request dated 1 November 2018 asking for statistics on children being trapped in self-locking vehicles. From the nature of your request Fire and Emergency has interpreted you are seeking information about children being trapped in vehicles as a result of the locking mechanism, rather than following a crash.

While Fire and Emergency records incidents on children locked in vehicles, we do not record whether vehicles involved in those incidents were self-locking. The statistics attached show:

- the number of incidents Fire and Emergency attended in the years 2014 to 2018
- incidents over the summer months for the same period
- areas with the highest and lowest numbers of calls.

During the time period you requested, the AA changed its procedure for responding to calls it receives regarding children locked in vehicles. All calls of this nature are now forwarded through to the 111 system for Fire and Emergency to respond.

You have the right to seek an investigation and review by the Ombudsman of this decision.
