

Fire Related Product Recall Notice

Date issued: 22 November 2016



Kambrook Essentials Microwave Oven 30L

Kambrook New Zealand have issued a recall on the Kambrook KMO Essentials 30 L (KMO400) microwave oven purchased nationwide during 2008 through to September 2013.

Problem

A potential component failure may lead to a fire, potentially resulting in damage and injury.

Details

Check the production date code, which can be found on the back of your oven on the rating label / barcode as shown below.

Serial number

If your microwave is within the date code range 833-1321 it may be affected: Ovens outside this date range are not affected by this recall.

What to do

Customers should immediately stop using your Microwave and unplug it from the socket outlet until you have checked the production batch code on the rating label. Owners should return the affected units to the place of purchase in exchange for a replacement Kambrook essentials Microwave Oven 30 L or a refund where a replacement is not available.
