Welcome

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting, followed by a karakia timatanga. Mihimihi followed the karakia, with introductions from new attendees.

Committee operations

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District update

The Region Manager outlined changes at Fire and Emergency's Executive Leadership Team level noting the creation of three new Deputy Chief Executive Roles. An update was provided on the collective bargaining process underway between Fire and Emergency and the New Zealand Professional Firefighters Union.

The District Manager provided a district update to the Committee. The Community Risk and Recovery (CRR) team are getting good traction with their outreach, notably with Toitū Tairāwhiti and Turanga Health. Following these successful interactions, an upcoming priority is to build more capacity in the recovery space.

Fire and Emergency are also meeting with St John and Police on the use of operational resources within the District to ensure communities remain well served by emergency services.

The Pou Takawaenga for Ngā Tai ki te Puku and Tairāwhiti CRR team joined the hui, introducing themselves and their respective work areas, and identified opportunities for collaboration with LAC members, particularly identifying gaps in engagement and understanding.

The Committee thanked the CRR team and Pou Takawaenga for attending the hui.

Tairāwhiti Local Advisory Committee Insights Report

The annual Insights Report was considered, where members discussed the work Region is undertaking to understand the impact of climate change on service delivery. The Committee noted the benefit of understanding how the changing nature of severe weather events can help futureproof service delivery across Tairāwhiti, and how this information would be useful as part of a wider study for other Fire and Emergency District teams.

Local planning presentation

The Strategy and Performance directorate presented on Fire and Emergency's national strategy, local planning and opportunities for the LAC to engage in the organisation's planning cycles.

The Planning team will engage with LAC Chairs through the Chair's Forum on the 10-Year Plan and Statement of Intent process. The Committee noted that they could contribute towards strategy development using the Board's priority areas to add local context.

How Fire and Emergency's strategies are meeting community aspirations was discussed and members queried on how the outcomes of these strategies are monitored.

Te Pae Tata – Communicating Wildfire Risk and Firebreak Policy

The Te Pae Tata programme presented the Communicating Wildfire Risk project and draft Firebreak Policy to the Committee. Members were asked to complete an insights survey ahead of the meeting.

The Communicating Wildfire Risk project aims to discover how communities understand and use fire danger information. Members noted that the changing profile in rural communities means that new property owners are likely to come from an urban background, highlighting that messaging needs to be accessible and make clear the actions people need to undertake.

The firebreak policy was discussed with the Committee as Te Pae Tata seeks to understand what community knowledge exists on fire breaks, and how to develop a clear policy and guidance document for the use and application of fire break provisions.

Engagement reporting

LAC members reported on engagements and mahi completed over the past quarter. These include d a social media analysis of the Tairāwhiti District Fire and Emergency Facebook page, media interviews with Radio Turanga and Ngāti Porou radio, hui with the Pakirikiri Marae committee, and securing a presentation spot for the CRR team at the Toitū Tairāwhiti housing symposium.

Engagement planning

The Committee discussed their engagement plans for the next quarter and agreed to keep the current momentum and continue to reach out to Tairāwhiti's communities. Members noted that engagement reports should be completed using the LAC template and submitted to the National LAC Team ahead of the next Committee meeting.
