The Northland Local Advisory Committee (the Committee) met at Kaikohe Fire Station with the Area Manager, Muri Whenua.

Welcome

The meeting began with a karakia and a welcome from the Chair.

Minutes

The minutes of the Committee's meeting on 27 May were confirmed.

RLT district update

The Regional Leadership Team (RLT) updated the Committee on development of the new district teams and recent incidents and work in Te Tai Tokerau.

Northland Fire Plan

The Fire Plans have now been finalised and the Area Manager gave a presentation on the final stages of development of the Northland Plan.

Civil Defence Emergency Management

Bill Hutchinson, Far North District Council's Civil Defence Coordinator and Chief Fire Officer of the Kaikohe brigade, brought members of the Civil Defence Emergency Management (CDEM) Northland team to meet the LAC and to talk about work and cooperation with Fire and Emergency. CDEM and Fire and Emergency have recently made joint visits to Taemaro Bay and Waimahana in the Far North, assisting the community with preparedness for emergencies, resilience and recovery strategies.

Community engagement

The Committee discussed community engagement undertaken since its previous meeting in May. Members met with Te Iwi o Roroa, alongside the Area Manager, noting that emergency response is a priority for this iwi. The community is planning to carry out its own GAP analysis.

Members engaged with Ngāti Wai, other iwi and hapū and government agencies at a pōwhiri at Mōkau Marae in Whangaruru, where the wharenui has been rebuilt after a fire incident.

Members met with Fire and Emergency and St John volunteers in Kohukohu, where attendees discussed challenges with volunteer sustainability, including to larger centres to work. LAC members were interested to learn about the five-week Youth and Cadet training programme developed in Northland by Police, St John, Fire and Emergency and the Northland Regional Council to provide volunteer training for young people in emergency services. There are older people in the community with skills to contribute and the LAC sees value in a volunteer attraction campaign in the Hokianga.

At a regular Kaipara Police-Iwi Liaison meeting, iwi noted that they would like more engagement from agencies at marae level. The LAC will continue to attend these hui, providing updates and identifying opportunities for partnership in communities.

Members will maintain a watching brief on local government changes currently being progressed, such as water reform and changes to roading and the Unitary Authority, with Fire and Emergency planning and community concerns in mind.

The Committee noted that the Far North District Council has deferred implementation of its Significant Natural Areas (SNAs) programme due to opposition and considerations such as the New Zealand Biodiversity Strategy.

Review of LAC role and purpose

The National LAC Team led a session reviewing LAC functions and responsibilities.

Engagement planning

Guided by district priorities and the LAC's experiences in its first year of operation, the Committee agreed on the following stakeholder priorities for the 2021-22 year:

- Isolated and vulnerable communities
- Iwi/hapū
- Fire and Emergency Volunteers
- CDEM/Coordinating Executives Group
- Health
- Industry brigades

In the coming year, the LAC will continue to focus on isolated and vulnerable communities, supporting people who don't generally have a voice by connecting them with Fire and Emergency and seeking partnership and risk reduction opportunities.

Members will also make use of Waitangi Day, Field Days and other community events to connect with a broad cross-section of the community, inform people of the role of the LAC, learn about community needs and identify engagement opportunities.

National LAC Team update

The National LAC Team provided updates on the appointment of the new Fire and Emergency Board Chair, next steps in the development of the framework to integrate LAC advice into Fire and Emergency and the Year 1 Evaluation of LACs.

Board report

The LAC Chair agreed to bullet point the content of the LAC's Board report for the quarter, to facilitate drafting of the report.

The meeting closed at 3:30pm.
