Other impacts -

- Upper North Island relief TTL ('97 Spartan) AUCK206 decommissioned.
- Type 5 32m ('07 Mercedes RLX) from Newtown becomes Upper North Island Relief (Auckland Based). No cascade training required as RLX already in Auckland (Type 6).
- South Island relief Type 5 ('86 Scania) SOUT507 decommissioned.
- South Island Relief TTL ('87 Mercedes Metz) decommissioned.

South Island will have one relief, CHC 215.

Budget -

The project has currently budgeted \$100,000 (\$20K per appliance) for cascade activities – including training.
